Android 9 para samsung s6

John MacDougall/AFP/Getty Images While many Samsung fans are busy reading rumors about the products the company plans to unveil this year, the current owners of the existing Samsung Galaxy S6 are finally seeing last year's flagship phone back in the news. That's because Samsung is finally pushing the latest version of Android to the Galaxy S6 and Galaxy S6 Edge, with an update for other smartphones and tablets to follow soon. As James Vincent reports for The Verge, Android Marshmallow will be available for download on the Galaxy S6 and Galaxy S6 Edge from February 15. Android 6.0 Marshmallow was announced last May and offers a number of new features, including Now on Tap, which puts the power of Google Now anywhere in the operating system so users can search for contextual information about almost anything. Also important are Marshmallow's new battery-saving features, its redesigned app drawer and app suggestions, and the revamped app permissions, which make it a little easier for users to figure out when and how apps access their data and use their privacy more effectively. Vincent notes that the biggest frustration with the latest version of Android has always been the update in the first place. What it characterizes as Samsung's non-existent upgrade schedule for devices other than the Galaxy S6 and Galaxy S6 Edge will still be waiting for tons of Samsung customers to update, even if it rolls out to S6 owners. Updates from other Android manufacturers have just begun to appear, with the LG G4 getting marshmallow on most carrier networks and Motorola Moto G are starting to get the update, too. It is likely that the Galaxy Note 5 and galaxy S6 edge+ are planned for upcoming marshmallow versions. Samsung, however, is vague about when exactly the owners of its other devices can expect the update, and says it will make separate announcements on details of the schedule of operating system updates for each market according to the market situation and airline requirements. According to Vincent's assessment, if you are a big Android fan who really wants the latest version of the operating system, your best bet is most likely to wait and buy a new device with it pre-installed. (Of course, Android Marshmallow was released more than three months ago on Nexus devices, which are still your best choice if you don't want to wait for hardware manufacturers to adopt the latest updates.) Chris Smith reports for BGR that the Galaxy S6 and Galaxy S6 Edge are the best Android phones Samsung has made so far, despite public criticism over the lack of a microSD card slot or a detachable battery. But the update fixes the biggest bug of the phones: that they don't version of Android. After various beta tests and Android 6.0 leaks, Samsung finally released the update. The Android 6.0 update brings all the features expected with the upgrade, and Galaxy S6 Edge users even get Functionality for the edge part of the device screen. The phone now has a larger or improved Edge screen that allows users to add more apps and view more in-app content. You can customize up to nine panels, including the People Edge panels and apps, which are now 550px wide, with more space for information and shortcuts. It is likely that some of these new edge features will also appear in the upcoming Galaxy S7 Edge models, which will likely run Android 6.0 Marshmallow out of the box. Samsung recently revealed that the Galaxy S7 will support the same kind of advanced edge features as its predecessor. Ron Amadeo reports for Ars Technica that while Samsung does not explicitly say so, the February 15 rollout is likely to apply only to unlocked international devices, and Samsung's announcement cryptically states that the company will make separate announcements on details of OS update plans for each market in line with market conditions and airline requirements. Last year, Samsung began rolling out Lollipop to the Galaxy S5 just 31 days after launch; for Marshmallow, this delay increased to 133 days. Of course, these numbers only apply to unlocked devices, and customers who buy their devices through carriers are subject to even longer delays as each wearer sticks their fingers into the update cake. Last year, Verizon was the fastest carrier to use the Galaxy S5 Lollipop update, adding 60 days to Samsung's release schedule. If airlines meet the same schedule this year, airlines' customers could take a six-month delay for their first major update. If you purchased your device from a carrier, you still need to do a lot before you can upgrade your Galaxy S6 or Galaxy S6 Edge. But if you purchased an unlocked device, you need to get the update. Tap the Settings icon, tap About The Device, and then tap Software Update. From there, you can tap Update Now to see if a new version of the software is available and follow the on-screen instructions to upgrade. When you download the update, make sure you are connected to Wi-Fi and make sure your phone is sufficiently charged before you start the process. Mophie includes a headphone adapter that you need. This housing is also protective with cushioning at the edges and corners to absorb the shock of impact. You can get it in black, white or gold. Amazon you notice the reinforced corners in this case immediately, and they make sure your Galaxy S6 will survive a fall of up to 6 feet. They also prevent your phone's body or screen from coming into contact with surfaces. The button covers are well defined and the cutouts are precise. This case adds grip, but the rubbery corners can tighten lint when you push it into your pocket. Amazon GoBallistic This dual-layer design consists of a shock-absorbing, textured TPU interior and a robust polycarbonate bumper in contrasting colors. It is a tight fit, with precise openings for the connectors and camera, and responsive button covers. The raised bezel helps to protect your screen. It is quite slim and should provide decent protection against impacts. Unfortunately, the textured back doesn't really add grip because the bumper is smooth. It is flexible, so it is easy to fit, and it is convenient to keep, add a little grip. There are accurate cutouts for all ports, buttons, sensors and the camera.
